

LOCAL TO NATIONAL POSTER CONTEST


Hosting a poster contest is a great way to engage students with your conservation district, and potentially earn state and national recognition for the student, school, and district!

The NACD National Poster Contest for the "May the Forest Be With You Always" theme will accept submissions from March-December 2024. Entries will be selected by your local district and sent to the state level for judging. State winning entries will then be sent to the national level, where one overall winner will be selected and announced at the 2025 NACD Annual Meeting in February 2025, and shared online.

NACD judges posters based on the following grade criteria:

- Conservation Message (50%)
 Originality (10%)
- Visual Effectiveness (30%)
- Overall Appeal (10%)
